Student engagement in the community is on the rise.

The Ann Richards School for Young Women Leaders (ARS) has been successful; 100 the 2013 and 2014 classes have a 100 percent college attendance rate. The school is propelling students toward success.

ARS manages community service with x2VOL

ARS uses x2VOL from intelliVOL, to streamline the tracking and reporting of students' service hours so that the focus remains on service, not paperwork.

With x2VOL, students log into their account and submit entries for completing community service hours. It's a secure online platform that keeps track of the hours submitted and generates an automated message to the non-profits students volunteer with, requesting verification of the students volunteer work.

“x2VOL provides a connection to the community as well as a way for the school

administrators to track the hours that the students are serving. Overall, x2VOL provides the authentication and verification students need for graduation.” Michele Pitman says, CEO and Founder of intelliVOL.

Over 60% of the graduating students at ARS are first generation college students. Each girl realizes how critical it is to have support from the community and mentors open to donors they had never thought were open to them. In turn, these students know that they have the ability to help others because so much has been given to them.

In the last 2 years, ARS students have logged close to 50,000 hours of community service. And each student will graduate from ARS with 100 or more hours of community service completed. It is a lot to manage but x2VOL has simplified the process to keep it manageable and successful.

STARS curriculum

All ARS students are required to be enrolled in a STARS class (Success Through Academics, Resiliency, and Service) where students experience a wide-array of learning and growth opportunities extending beyond academics into the community to build relationships.

Service is part of the formation of the student's character, school's culture and expectation. Each STARS student is required to participate in community service and complete a certain number of hours depending on their grade level. Seniors work in interdisciplinary groups on a Capstone Project addressing a specific community need. It takes extensive planning to make sure each student's project is aligned with her academic and growth goals.

"It's a mindset focused on the goal," said Doy Roberts a teacher who leads the STARS special curriculum. She says students go above the expectation and even volunteer more than 300 hours when they find a service fitting their personal goals or tugging at their heart. Students often connect strongly with the organization's mission and start to really care about the people they are helping. Students begin to recognize that they are a vital link in system and greatly value their work.

But, they must also take care of business. Students are

responsible for tracking their own hours and are accountable for the outcome. ARS students appreciate that x2VOL equips them with a tool for success.

Standing out on college applications

Through Naviance's Family Connection, students have a quick link to x2VOL where they track hours and write reflections about their service.

"The reflection feature in x2VOL is a great tool...having everything in one place is beneficial." Roberts says.

Eric Heineman, College Counselor at ARS, sees the benefit of writing reflections for service beginning in sixth grade. He calls it, "The art of writing a reflection." Continually writing reflections of service is a unique experience preparing students for writing college and essays that are posted in Naviance's journal feature.

Heineman says x2VOL service transcripts illustrate a student's most meaningful service experiences, which demonstrates maturity. A student without service on their application can't compete with those that do, adds Eric. He emphasized that colleges notice the absence of service.

"Students who show they were involved with service demonstrate maturity." Heineman shares.
